

LINKING CHAIRS WITH RE-USEABLE STRAPS

Benenden Village Hall has a supply of reuseable Velcro-style ‘hook and loop’ straps that can be used to securely link chairs together.

To link 180 chairs together in 15 rows of 12 seats requires 330 straps when using the recommended 1 pair of straps to link 2 adjacent chairs (with a strap linking adjacent front legs and a strap linking adjacent rear legs).

Straps are stored in pairs with their ‘sticky’ sides together. This makes the straps easier to store and use by preventing pairs from sticking to other straps.



Each pair of straps can be separated by holding the buckles and gently pulling them apart.



A strap should be placed around a pair of adjacent legs with the ‘sticky’ side on the outside. The end of the strap should then be passed through the buckle and pulled tight. The overlapping part of the strap should then be folded back upon itself so that the ‘sticky’ side of the overlap sticks to the ‘sticky’ part of the strap around the legs.



This should be repeated for each of the adjacent front and rear legs.

After use, straps should be removed by separating the overlapping part of the strap (opposite end to the buckle) from the rest of the strap and pulling it back through the buckle.

Care should be taken to not remove the buckle from the strap.

Pairs of straps should then be joined together and placed back into storage.
